## W.C.R.O. Will of Adrianna Mason of Lighthorne 1639.

In the Name of God Amen, 2nd October A.D. 1638, I Adrianna Mason of Lighthorne in the county of Warwick, widow, being sick in body but of perfect memory God be praised for the same, do ordain & make this my Last Will and Testament in manner & form following. First I bequeath my soul to the blessed Trinity, God the Father, God the Son, and God the holy Ghost, in sure & certain hope of Resurrection to eternal life at the last day through Gods mercy and Christs Merits. And my body to be buried in the churchyard of Lighthorne abovesaid. And as for my worldly goods I give & bequeath in manner & form following: Item I give & bequeath unto Elianor Hyharne eldest daughter of William Hyharne twenty shillings.

Item I give & bequeath unto Isabell Hyharne second daughter of William Hyharne twenty shillings.

Item I give & bequeath unto Mariella Hyharne third daughter of William Hyharne twenty shillings.

Item I give & bequeath unto William Hyharne son of William Hyharne twenty shillings. Item I give & bequeath unto ---- Hyharne wife of the said William Hyharne twenty shillings. Item I give & bequeath unto Margrette Hemming of Lighthorne abovesaid ten shillings. Item whereas William Hyharne the elder is laying at my charge the sum of five pounds to whomsoever I appoint, my will & mind is that the said sum of five pounds shall be employed and bestowed upon my funeral charges, and other duties thereunto belonging: and the remainder of that -----for to remain unto the said William Hyharne.

Item I revoke all former wills, testaments & promises & do ordain this my Last Will and Testament to stand in law.

Item I appoint & ordain the legacies above mentioned to be payed by the said William Hyharne within one half year after my departure.

Item I ordain William Hyharne the elder my sole executor to see this my Last Will and Testament performed. In witness whereof I have put my hand to these --- the year & day above written. 1638.
