## W.C.R.O. Will of Henry Ward of Warwick 1735.

In the Name of God Amen, I Henry Ward of the Borough of Warwick yeoman being of sound and disposing mind memory and understanding do make this my Last Will and Testament in manner following.

First I give and bequeath unto Ann Tomlins the wife of John Tomlins senior of Gutherton the sum of five pounds.

Item I give and bequeath unto Henry and Mary son and daughter of my late brother John Ward the sum of five pounds a piece.

Item I give and bequeath unto William Mary Margaret Sarah Ann and Elizabeth Ward, son and daughters of my late brother Edward Ward the sum of five pounds a piece. Item I give and bequeath unto Samuel Etherige and Hannah Etherige one guinea a piece. Item I give and bequeath unto Thomas Ward and Ann Ward, grandson and granddaughter of my late brother Anthony Ward five pounds a piece. all which several legacies above mentioned my will is shall be paid within twelve months after my decease and lastly all the rest and residue of my goods chattels and personal estate whatsoever I give and bequeath unto Thomas Ward, Mercer in Warwick, son of my late brother Anthony Ward and do hereby nominate constitute and appoint the said Thomas Ward my sole executor of this my Last Will and Testament. Witness whereof I have put my hand and seal this third day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and thirty five. Henry Ward Signed sealed published and declared by the said Henry Ward in the presence of Us who have at his Request subscribed our names as witnesses in his presence.
