## L.D.R.O. Will of John Green of Avon Dasset 1766

In the Name of God Amen. I John Green of the Parish of Avon Dasset in the County of Warwick Yeoman, being through the abundant mercy and goodness of God, tho' weak & infirm in body,yet of a sound and perfect mind and memory do make and ordain this my Last Will and Testament in manner and form following.( that is to say )

First I give and bequeath unto my eldest daughter Jane Cox the sum of one guinea only, she having before hand received the Fortune intended for her.

Also I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Padbury the sum of forty pounds of the lawful money of great Britain, twenty pounds to be paid her at the end of the year after my decease and the other twenty pounds to be paid her at the end of the year ensuing after that.

Also I give and bequeath unto my daughter Kezia Fincher the like sum of forty pounds of the lawful money of great Britain, twenty pounds to be paid her at the end of the year after my decease and the other twenty pounds to be paid her at the end of the year ensuing after that.

Also I give and bequeath unto my loving wife Jane Green all and every my messuage Land and Tenement, Goods and Chattels, ready money, rents, securities of money and all my real and personal estate whatsoever, and not herein otherwise disposed of.

And I do hereby make ordain nominate constitute and appoint her the said Jane Green my beloved wife,my sole executrix of this my Last Will and Testament requiring her to pay all my legacies bequeathed as above and also all my just debts and funeral expencies after my decease; and I do hereby declare this to be my Last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have set my hand and seal the tenth day of June in the year of Our Lord One thousand seven hundred and sixty six.
