

W.C.R.O. Will of Judith Jeacock of Lighthorne 1721.

(The first eight lines of this copy are illegible)-----

Item I give & devise unto my nephew **Thomas Jeacock** the sum of forty pounds of lawful Brittanic money.

Item I give & devise unto my sister **Anne Palmer** the sum of twenty pounds.

Item I give & devise unto my cousins **Judith Nicholls** and **Sarah Nicholls** the sum of twenty pounds a piece. I give & devise to my cousin **Elizabeth Palmer** the sum of twenty pounds.

Item I give & devise unto my cousins **Alexander Nicholls** and **Leonard Nicholls** the sum of ten pounds a piece.

Item I give & devise the residue and remainder of the money due in the same note to my sister **Elizabeth** the wife of **Alexander Nicholls** (my just debts and funeral expences being discharged)

Item I give & devise all my wearing apparel between my said sisters **Elizabeth Nicholls** and **Anne Palmer** to be equally divided between them.

Item my will is that the said legacies shall be paid within one year after my decease. And lastly I do hereby nominate & appoint my said sister **Elizabeth Nicholls** sole executrix of this my last will & testament hereby revoking all former wills by me heretofore made. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this two & twentieth day of January in the eighth year of the reign of King George 1st A.D. 1721.
