In the name of God Amen I Richard Leyghe of the parish of Lighthorne in the diocese of Worcester sick of body but of perfect mind and good memory, Thanks be to God, do ordain and make on the 23rd day of April A.D. 1589. this my last will & testament in manner & form following. First I commend my soul in to the hands of Almighty God, and my body to be buried in the churchyard of Lighthorne aforesaid in full & certain hope of the Resurrection of the same to eternal life in the last day.

Item I give unto Thomas Leighe my kinsman a ewe and lamb. Item to Anne Leighe my kinswoman 12d.

Item to Francys Leighe my sons daughter the third part of my sheep.

All The rest of my goods and chattels (my debts being paid & my funeral discharged) I give and bequeath to Margaret my wife, whom I make my sole executrix of this my Last Will and Testament to do therein as God shall give her grace, according to the true meaning thereof. Witnesses present at the making hereof William Smart parson, and Thomas Mason the elder: whom I make mine overseers.

First Leonard Smythe 20s.
