## W.C.R.O. Will of Richard Rose of Ilmington 1647.

In the Name of God Amen the sixth and twentieth day of December one thousand six hundred and forty five I Richard Rose of Ilmington in the county of Warwick being sick in body but of good & perfect memory do make this my Last Will and Testament in manner & form following. First I commend my soul unto Almighty God in & by my Saviour Jesus Christ and my body to be buried in full assurance of a joyful Resurrection.

Item I give & bequeath unto Elizabeth Oakley the daughter of William Oakley twenty pounds to be paid within four years after my decease by Thomas Smith now living & being in Ilmington and during the term and time of the said four years he the said Thomas Smith is to pay to the above named Elizabeth Oakley five shillings weekly.

Item I give unto the children of William Phillips two & twenty pounds which shall be to each of his sons seven pounds a piece and to his daughter Mary eight pounds which shall be paid within a year after my decease.

Item I give & bequeath unto Richard Smith the son of Thomas Smith eight pounds to be paid to him within a year after my decease.

Item I give & bequeath unto John Courte ten shillings to be paid to him within a year after my decease.

Item I give and bequeath unto the children of Edward Coldicote twelve pence a piece to be paid to them within a year after my decease.

Item I give & bequeath unto the poor of Ilmington twenty shillings to be disposed of according to the discretion of Thomas Smith.

Item I give & bequeath three pounds which moneys shall be to discharge all such occasions as shall concern my funeral to be paid by the executor. The rest of my goods and chattels movable & unmovable my debts & legacies being discharged and paid I give & beqeath unto my daughter Anne Rose whom I make my sole & whole executrix of this my Last Will and Testament and in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the day and year above written. Richard Rose his mark.

Sealed subscribed and published by the above named Richard Rose in the presence of , William Allin Richard Coldicote Robert Coldicote Thomas Smith.

This testament was proved 3rd April 1647 before the Ven, James Littleton etc.Anne Rose alias Hurleston was duly sworn to administer etc.being the daughter and named executor of the deceased.
