

W.C.R.O. Will of Elizabeth Greene 1686

In the name of God Amen the 10th day of April 1686 I Elizabeth Greene of Lighthorne in the county of Warwick widow being of perfect memory and remembrance praised be God do make and ordaine this my last will and testament in manner and form following. Firstly I bequeath my soul into the hands of Almighty God my maker and redeemer to receive free pardon of all my sins and as for my body to be buried in Christian buriall at the charge of my executors here after mentioned.

Item I give unto my daughter **Mary Greene** three pair of flax sheets and three pair of hemp and two dozen of napkins and the bed over the hall and the truckle bed one feather bed one hilling two pair of blankets two pair of holland pillow boards two table cloths the curtains belonging to the bed one trunk in money five pounds and five ten shillings which is in my brother **Jeacocks** hands.

Item I give to my son **John Greene** one shift one hilling one pair of pillow boards two pair of sheets.

Item I give to my son **Leonard Greene** all the rest of my goods and whatsoever belongeth to me paying my daughter **Mary Greene** a hundred and ten pounds being a legacy given by my husband **Thomas Greene** and I do make my son **Leonard Greene** sole executor of this my last will and testament revoking all other wills and testaments. In witness here of I have here unto set my hand and seal the day and year above written. **Elizabeth Greene** her mark.
