

**W.C.R.O. Will of Lawrence Green. 1558.**

In the name of God Amen in the year of Our Lord God (missing) the twentieth day of August I Lawrence Grene sick of body (missing) perfect of memory make this my last will & T (missing) in manner and form following First I bequeath my soul to almighty God and blessed lady saint mary & all the saints in heaven to pray for me and my body to be buried in the churchyard.

Item I give to the mother church -----

Item I give to the church of Lighthorne a strike of barley to be paid at our lady in Lent

Item I bequeath to **William** my son an hundred shillings to be paid at twenty three years of age

Item I bequeath to **John** my son forty shillings to be delivered to him at eighteen years of age

Item I bequeath to **Richard** my son twenty six shillings and eight pence to be delivered to him at eighteen years of age

Item I bequeath to **Elizabeth** my daughter twenty six shillings and eight pence a pot a pan four pots of pewter three pairs of sheets --- be delivered at sixteen years of age

Item I give to **Margaret Benet** my servant a land of wheat and an other of barley

Item give to every one of my godchildren two shillings

The residue of my goods movable & immovable not bequeathed I give them to **Jone** my wife whom I make my sole executrix seeing my will performed & my debts paid

These being my overseers **Leonard Smith & John Townsend**

These being witnesses \_\_\_\_ **Richard Burton Alyn Mason** with others.

Proved before Rev Turnbull at Lighthorne 27th April 1559
